End “trench warfare,” Corbyn urges Britain’s Labour Party

JEREMY Corbyn, leader of Britain’s main opposition Labour Party, called on his lawmakers yesterday to end “trench warfare” and unite to challenge the ruling Conservatives and deliver “socialism of the 21st century.”

Corbyn, re-elected as leader at the weekend after a divisive contest, said he wanted to win back trust in Labour. The party was dealt a crushing election defeat by the ruling Conservatives last year, when many voters cast doubt on whether the party’s left-wing programme would protect the economy.

Despite attracting hundreds of thousands of new members to join the Labour Party, he faces a daunting task to impose his authority on his own lawmakers and sell his socialist policies to the wider electorate.

He is also facing criticism that he fails to understand Britons’ widespread concerns over immigration - a key factor that prompted them to vote in June to leave the European Union.

“Our job is now to win over the unconvinced to our vision. Only that way can we secure the Labour government we need and let’s be frank, no one will be convinced of a vision promoted by a divided party,” Corbyn told his party’s annual conference in the northern city of Liverpool

British tourist arrested for leaving her seven-year-old alone

Palma.—A 25-year-old British female tourist has been detained by National Police based in Manacor and charged with neglect of a child.

In the early hours of Tuesday morning, several guests at a hotel in Calas de Mallorca alerted reception to a child who was crying inconsolably. Police were called and established that the child, a boy of seven, was on his own in the hotel room.

Officers were told that he was on holiday with his mother and had woken up and found himself alone. It was not the first

time that this had happened. Police went looking for the mother, who was eventually found at 07.30 as she was returning to the hotel after a night out at various establishments in the resort.

She was detained on suspicion of child neglect and taken to the National Police station in Manacor.

While a court decides what action will be taken, the boy has been taken into care at a Council of Majorca reception centre for minors, there being no relatives on the island to look after him.
