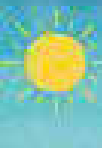

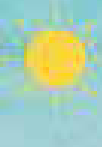

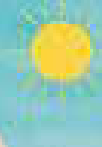

Your Mallorca map of the Blue Flag beaches

The Balearics have 46 'Blue Flags', four more than in 2023.

This summer, a total of 46 beaches, marinas and boats in the Balearics will fly a 'Blue Flag', which will make it the sixth community in Spain with the most awards in 2024 with four more than last year.

Palma has managed to win two more flags for Ciudad Jardín and Cala Estància.

But, Colònia de Sant Jordi, Es Dolç has lost its flag.

Along with Palma, the municipalities of Felanitx (Cala Marçal, Cala Sa Nau and Portocolom), Pollensa (Cala Barques, Formentor and

Cala Molins) and Santanyi (Cala Mondragó, Cala Santanyi and S'Amarador) have landed the most blue flags this year.

So, Mallorca has been awarded 20 blue flags, a seal of quality that recognises the good state of the waters, the high level of beach services and the safety offered to bathers.

The Association for Environmental and Consumer Education

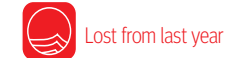
(Adeac) is in charge of awarding these recognitions and has also awarded a special mention for its accessibility and attention to people with disabilities to the municipality of Alcúdia. In total, Spain has obtained a total of 747

'Blue Flags' - 638 beaches, 102 marinas and seven tourist boats - which will fly from June, 18 more than in 2023, with the Valencia Region

being the leading region in number of beaches with this distinction.

MEDUSAPP:
Real-Time Jellyfish Monitoring in the Balearic Islands

MedusApp is a Spanish mobile application designed for comprehensive jellyfish monitoring. Developed by Eduardo Blasco and Ramón Palacios from the Polytechnic University of Valencia, this app offers detailed and real-time data about jellyfish presence along Spanish coasts, in-



cluding the Balearic Islands. MedusApp features a daily updated map showing jellyfish concentrations, making it an indispensable tool for beachgoers. Users can see not only the number of jellyfish but also their typology and real-time photos, providing a clearer understanding of current beach conditions. This app stands out by offering additional

features such as first aid advice for jellyfish stings, which can be crucial for immediate response.

Moreover, MedusApp includes a jellyfish guide, categorizing species from most to least venomous. This allows users to



quickly assess the potential danger of jellyfish in the area. By providing this extensive information, MedusApp enhances safety and helps users make informed decisions about their beach visits

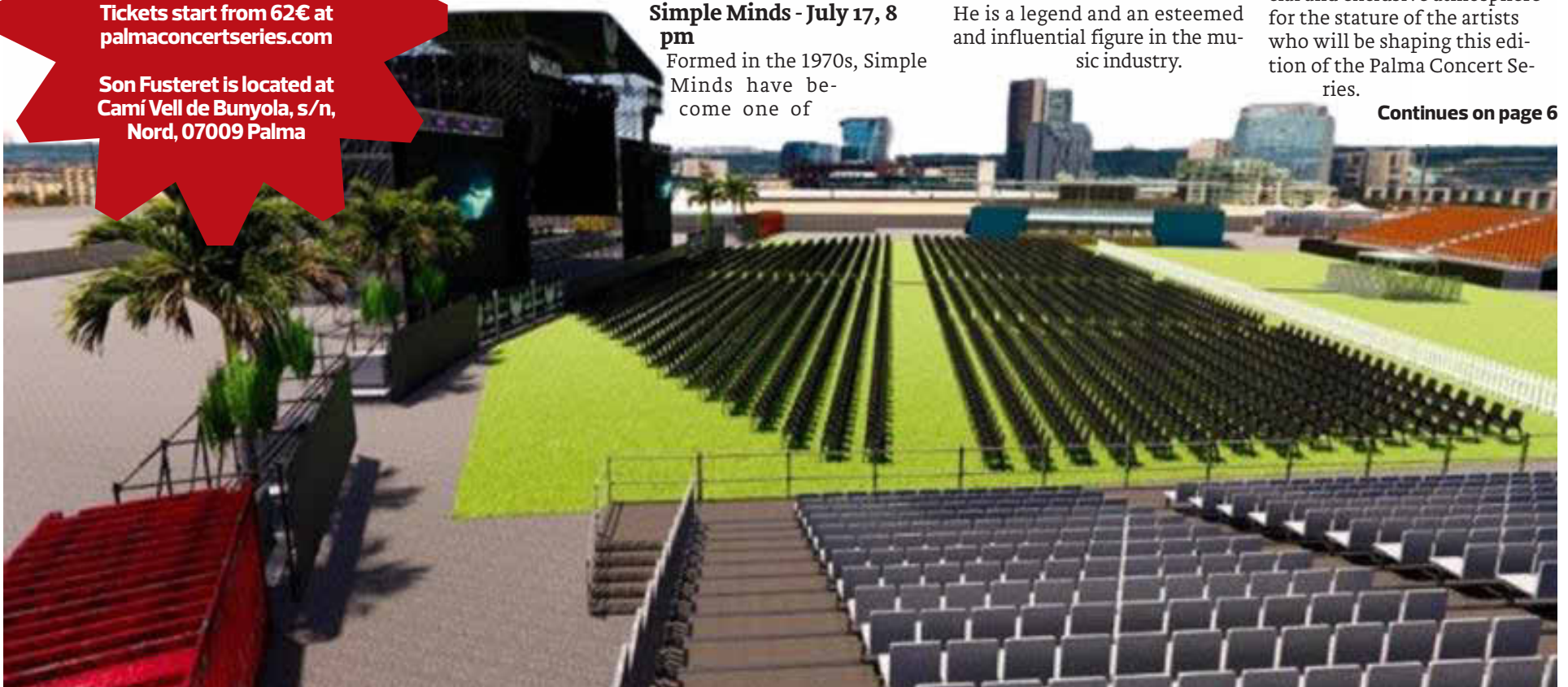

Simple Minds

Wednesday, July 17 at 8 pm

Simple Minds are a Scottish rock band formed in Glasgow in 1977. They gained international fame with a string of hit singles, most notably "Don't You (Forget About Me)" (1985), which topped the Billboard Hot 100 in the United States. Other major hits include "Promised You a Miracle" (1982), "Glittering Prize" (1982), "Someone Somewhere in Summertime" (1982), "Waterfront" (1983), "Alive and

"Kicking" (1985), "Sanctify Yourself" (1986), "Let There Be Love" (1991), "See the Lights" (1991), and their UK number one single "Belfast Child" (1989).

The band has achieved considerable success on the UK Singles Chart with 24 top 40 singles and on the UK Albums Chart with 23 top 40 albums, including five number one al-

bums: *Sparkle in the Rain* (1984), *Once Upon a Time* (1985), *Live in the City of Light* (1987), *Street Fighting Years* (1989), and *Glittering Prize 81/92* (1992). With over 60 million albums sold worldwide, Simple Minds were the most commercially successful Scottish band of the 1980s. They have also enjoyed chart success in the

United States, Australia, Germany, Spain, Italy, and New Zealand. Despite various personnel changes over the years, they continue to record and tour, maintaining a strong presence in the music industry.

In recognition of their contributions to music, Simple Minds were awarded the Q Inspiration Award in 2014 and an Ivor Novello Award in 2016 for Outstanding Song Collection from the British Academy of Songwriters, Composers, and Authors (BASCA). They have also received nominations for the MTV Video Music Award for Best Direction and Best Art Direction for "Don't You (Forget About Me)" in 1985, the Brit Award for British Group in 1986, and the American Music Award for Favorite Pop/Rock Band/Duo/Group in 1987. Additionally, "Belfast Child" was nominated for Song of the Year at the Brit Awards in 1990.

Singer Jim Kerr and guitarist Charlie Burchill are the two members who have been with Simple Minds throughout its entire history. The current lineup also includes bassist

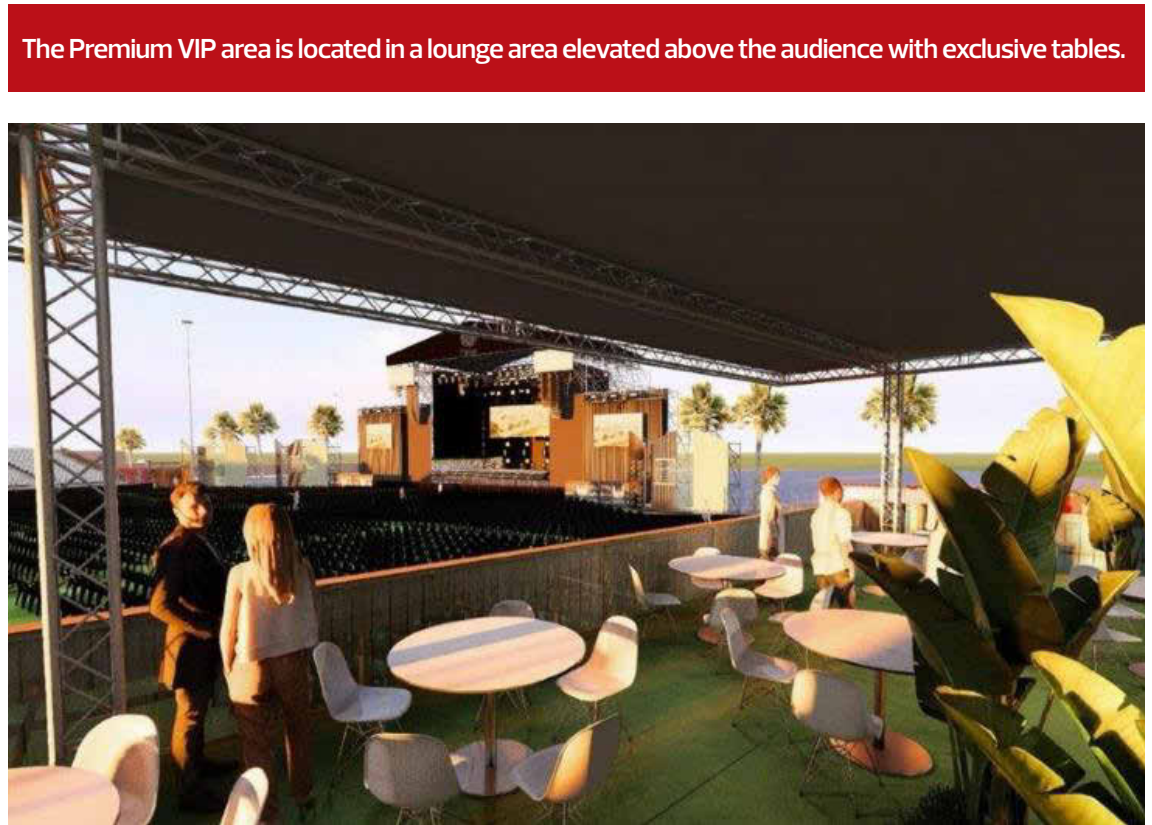
Ged Grimes, drummer Cherisse Osei, backing singer Sarah Brown, guitarist and keyboardist Gordy Goudie, and keyboardist Erik Ljunggren. Notable former members include keyboardist Mick MacNeil, bassists Derek Forbes and John Giblin, and drummers Brian McGee and Mel Gaynor.

From their origins in the punk scene to their evolution into a major rock band, Simple Minds have consistently demonstrated their ability to adapt and thrive. Their enduring legacy is a testament to their talent, resilience, and the timeless appeal of their music. With a career spanning several decades, Simple Minds remain a significant and influential force in the world of rock music.

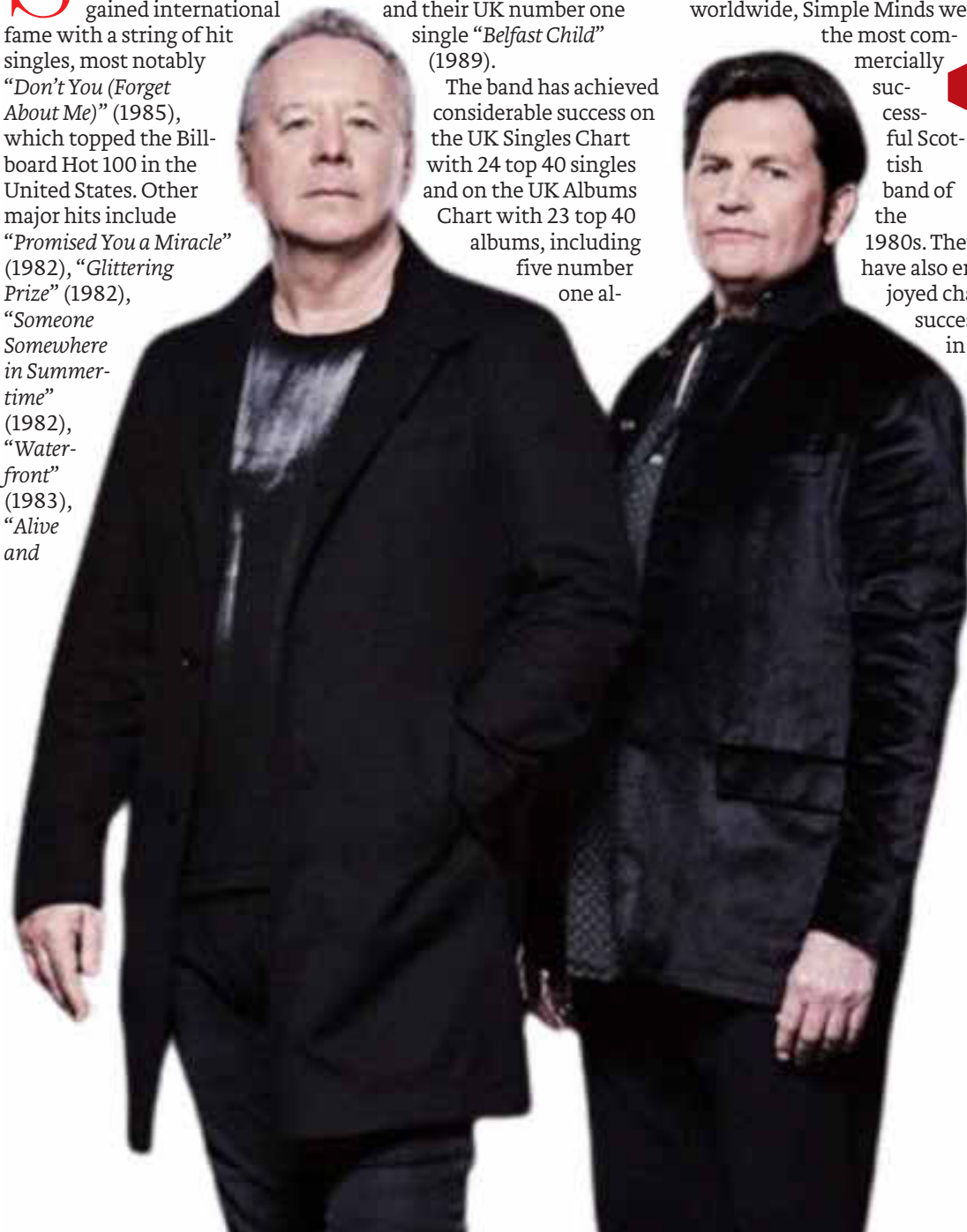

James Blunt

James Blunt is an English singer, songwriter, and musician who has made a significant impact on the music industry since his debut. Blunt has released seven albums since 2004, selling over 20 million records worldwide. Before his music career, Blunt served in the British Army. He rose to fame in 2004 with his debut album *Back to Bedlam*, which featured the globally successful singles “You’re Beautiful” and “Goodbye My Lover.” *Back to Bedlam* sold over 12 million copies worldwide, topped the UK Albums Chart, and peaked at number two in the US. The single “You’re Beautiful” reached number one in thirteen countries, including the UK and the US, contributing to *Back to Bedlam* becoming the best-selling album of the 2000s in the UK and one of the best-selling albums in UK chart history.

Blunt’s second album, *All the Lost Souls* (2007), also achieved significant success, reaching number one in twelve countries. He continued to release more albums: *Some Kind of Trouble* (2010), *Moon Landing* (2013), *The Afterlove* (2017), *Once Upon a Mind* (2019), and *Who We Used to Be* (2023).

Throughout his career, Blunt has received numerous accolades, including two Brit Awards for Best British Male in 2006, two MTV Video Music Awards, two Ivor Novello Awards, and five Grammy Award nominations. In 2016, he was awarded an Honorary Doctorate of Music by the University of Bristol.

Blunt primarily resides on the Spanish island of Ibiza but also owns a chalet in Switzerland, where he has a ski lift named after him and co-owns the restaurant La Vache.

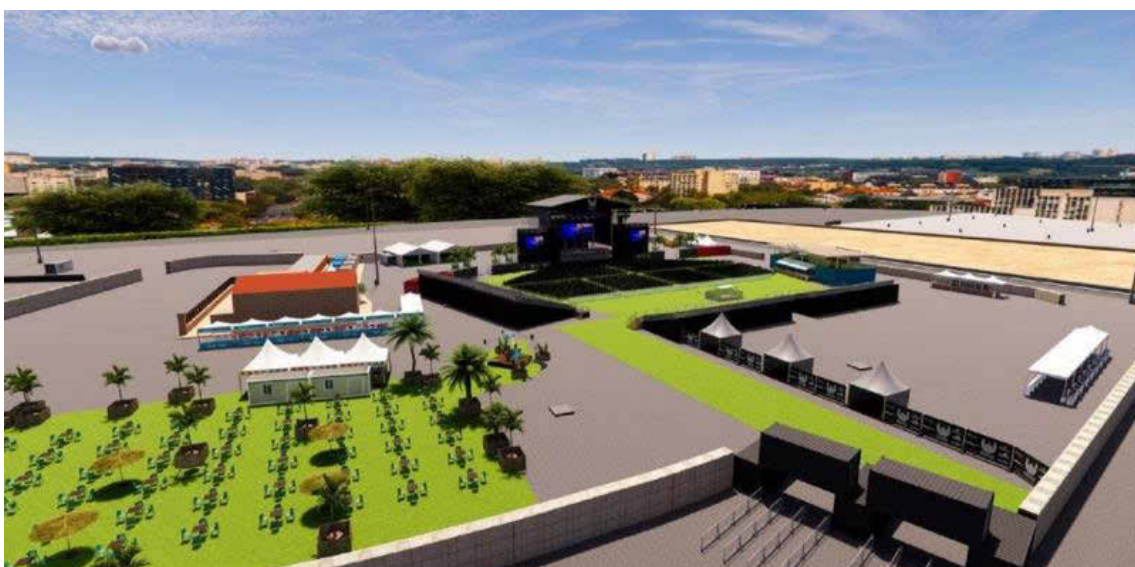
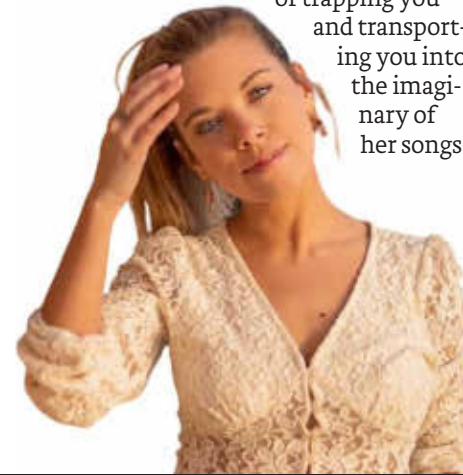
In 2014, he married Sofia Wellesley, the granddaughter of the 8th Duke of Wel-

lington, in Campanet in Mallorca. Blunt is known for his active and humorous presence on Twitter, where he has over two million followers. In 2020, he published a book of his tweets titled *How to Be a Complete and Utter Blunt: Diary of a Reluctant Social Media Sensation*.

Tom Jones

Sir Thomas Jones Woodward, known professionally as Tom Jones, is a celebrated Welsh singer. Renowned for his powerful, robust baritone voice, Jones’s career began in the 1960s with a series of top 10 hits. His remarkable ability to adapt across various musical genres, including pop, R&B, show tunes, country, dance, soul, and gospel, has cemented his place in music history. Jones’s breakthrough came

with hits like “It’s Not Unusual,” “What’s New Pussycat?,” and “Green, Green Grass of Home.” His song “Thunderball” served as the theme for the James Bond film of the same name, further establishing his global appeal. Over his career, he has sold over 100 million records, including 36 Top 40 hits in the UK and 19 in the US. Notable tracks like “Delilah,” “She’s a Lady,” “Sex Bomb,” and his cover of Prince’s “Kiss” have become



timeless classics. Apart from his music career, Jones has occasionally ventured into acting. He made his acting debut in the television film *Pleasure Cove* (1979) and ap-

peared as himself in Tim Burton’s film *Mars Attacks!* (1996). In 1970, he was nominated for a Golden Globe Award for his television series *This Is Tom Jones*. In 2012, he played a dramatic role in an episode of *Playhouse Presents*.

Jones’s contributions to music have been recognized with numerous awards, including a Grammy Award for Best New Artist in 1966, an MTV Video Music Award in 1989, and two Brit Awards for Best British Male (2000) and Outstanding Contribution to Music (2003). He was appointed an Officer of the Order of the British Empire (OBE) in 1998 and was knighted by Queen Elizabeth II in 2006 for his services to music.

In the 2010s, Jones experienced a resurgence in popularity as a coach on *The Voice UK*, serving from 2012 to 2015 and returning in 2017. His personal life includes a long marriage to his high school girlfriend, Melinda Rose “Linda” Trenchard, from 1957 until her death in 2016.

Following the election of a Labour government in 1974, Jones became a tax exile, moving to the United States and even-

tually purchasing a mansion in Los Angeles from Dean Martin. He later sold it to Nicolas Cage. Jones’s friendship with Elvis Presley was a significant part of his life, beginning in 1965 and continuing until Presley’s death in 1977.

In 2015, Jones published his autobiography, *Over the Top and Back*, which provides an entertaining account of his life and career. Known for his enduring voice and versatility, Tom Jones remains an iconic figure in the music industry.

Opening act

A young talent who is making her mark on the international music scene. Roberta Fauteck has music in her blood, at her young age she can already boast of having stepped on the stage of *The Voice Kids Spain* and Germany edition, the Café Real Madrid Bernabeu and Eurovision Jr. RTVE among others.



Anastacia is an American singer-songwriter. She burst onto the music scene with her debut studio album, *Not That Kind*, in 2000. The album's lead single, "I'm Outta Love," achieved worldwide success and established her as a prominent new female pop artist. Following this, Anastacia released her second studio album, *Freak of Nature*, in 2001. This period cemented her status in the music industry, with hits like "Not That Kind," "Paid My Dues," "One Day In Your Life," and the official 2002 FIFA World Cup song, "Boom."

Anastacia's career faced a significant challenge when she was diagnosed with breast cancer. However, she

made a triumphant return with her third studio album, *Anastacia*, in 2004. This album marked a stylistic shift towards a more rock-influenced sound and topped charts in 11 countries, becoming

Europe's second-best-selling album of the year. By 2006, her first three albums had sold a combined total of 20 million copies worldwide.

In 2006, her duet with Eros Ramazzotti, "I Belong to You (Il Ritmo della Passione)," topped charts across Europe, further solidifying her international appeal. After changing record labels, she released her fourth studio album, *Heavy Rotation*, in 2008, which had an R&B influence. In 2012, she ventured into covers of male rock songs with

the album *It's a Man's World*.

Anastacia returned to her pop-rock roots with *Resurrection* in 2014, which debuted in the top ten of several European charts.

Her 2017 album *Evolution* continued this trend, featuring the lead single "Caught in the Middle." In 2023, she released *Our Songs*, an album of German songs translated into English, showcasing her versatility.

Throughout her career, Anastacia has sold 50 million records worldwide and achieved number-one singles in 19 countries. Her powerful mezzo-soprano voice and signature darkly-tinted glasses have made her instantly recognizable.

She has received numerous accolades, including MTV Europe Music Awards, World Music Awards, and NRJ Music Awards.

Anastacia's personal life has been marked by her battle with several health issues. She has faced breast cancer twice and has Crohn's disease, which left her with a scar on her abdomen, another of her trademarks.

Despite these challenges, she has remained a resilient and influential figure in the music industry. In recognition of her efforts in raising breast cancer awareness, she became the second woman to receive the Humanitarian Award at the GQ Men of the Year Awards in 2013.

Anastacia's enduring success and her commitment to her craft and philanthropy have made her one of the most respected and beloved artists of her generation.

There's only a few weeks to go until this year's Port Adriano Music Festival, which is fast becoming one of the best musical events in the Balearic Islands.

It began in 2013 and since then, more than 80,000 people have attended concerts by huge stars including Gloria Gaynor, Earth Wind & Fire, Buena Vista Social Club, Hombres G, The Jacksons, UB40, Tom Jones and George Benson.

Kicking off the festival on Sunday, July 28, is the legendary **Sister Sledge**, an American musical vocal group from Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Formed in 1971, the group originally consisted of sisters Debbie, Joni, Kim, and Kathy Sledge. They achieved international success at the height of the disco era with their breakthrough album *'We Are Family'* in 1979. This album peaked at number three on the Billboard 200 and included the US top-10 singles *'He's the Greatest Dancer'* and *'We Are Family'*, the latter earning a Grammy Award nomination for Best R&B Performance by a Duo or Group with Vocal.

Sister Sledge's other notable US singles include a 1982 remake of Mary Wells' *'My Guy'*, *'Mama Never Told Me'* (1973), and *'Thinking of You'* (1984). In 1985, they topped the UK Singles Chart with *'Frankie'*, and remixed versions of three of their singles returned them to the UK Top 20 in 1993. Despite Kathy pursuing a solo career in 1989, she continued to tour with the group occasionally. The group has seen several lineup changes over the years, with notable performances including a 2015 show for Pope Francis at the World Festival of Families in Philadelphia.

Renowned for their infectious rhythms and soulful vocals, Sister Sledge continues to enchant audiences around the globe, spreading joy and unity through their music.

Following Sister Sledge's electri-

fying performance, Friday, August 2, sees the incomparable **Youssou N'Dour & Le Super Étoile de Dakar** take the stage.

Widely regarded as one of the greatest singers of our time, Youssou N'Dour has remained true to his Senegalese roots, captivating audiences with his mesmerizing voice and dynamic stage presence. Backed by the energetic rhythms of Le Super Étoile, N'Dour delivers a performance that transcends borders and unites cultures. On Saturday, August 3, the festival welcomes the esteemed Brazilian composer and guitarist, **Toquinho**, accompanied by the avant-garde vocalist **Camilla Faustino**. With a career spanning over five decades,

Toquinho is hailed as a luminary of Brazilian music, enchanting audiences with his soulful melodies and

Getting there

There is parking available inside and out the port. Alternatively, you can take the **TIB bus line 106**. To make it in time for the concert, there are buses leaving Palma at 7.40pm and 8.50pm (Monday to Saturday) and 7.30pm (Sunday) making stops at Marineland, Son Caliu, Palmanova and Son Ferrer.

virtuosic guitar playing. Joined by the captivating vocals of Camilla Faustino, the duo promises to transport listeners to the vibrant streets of Rio de Janeiro, celebrating the rich musical heritage of Brazil.

Rounding off the festival on Saturday, August 10, is the iconic German band, **Alphaville**. Formed in Münster in 1982, Alphaville became synonymous with the synth-pop and new wave movements of the

1980s. Founded by singers Marian Gold,

Bernhard Lloyd, and Frank Mertens, the band achieved

chart success with hits like *'Forever Young'*, *'Big in Japan'*, *'Sounds Like a Melody'*, *'The Jet Set'*, and *'Dance with Me'*. The band's name was inspired by Jean-Luc Godard's 1965 science fiction film *Alphaville*.

Marian Gold, the only continuous member of the band, along with Lloyd, first conceived Alphaville after meeting in West Berlin in 1981.

Influenced by UK indie acts like Tubeway Army, Gary Numan, and Orchestral Manoeuvres in the Dark (OMD), Gold wrote *'Big in Japan'* in 1979, inspired by Holly Johnson's band of the same name. The band's first

concert took place on December 31, 1982, in Enger, Westphalia.

In 1984, Alphaville released their debut single, *'Big in Japan'*. Reflecting on their early years, Gold noted that none of them could play an instrument initially; they relied heavily on synthesizers and drum machines.

Despite using what Gold described as "the cheapest monophonic synthesizers" in a makeshift basement studio, their demo tapes garnered multiple record deal offers, propelling them to swift success.

Led by the charismatic Marian Gold, Alphaville continues to captivate audiences with electrifying performances, proving that their music transcends time and resonates with listeners worldwide.

Port Adriano is located in El Toro, Calvia. The port has a wide range of restaurants, including Italian,

Mallorcan, Mediterranean, Fish, Grill, Vegan and many

more options so you can grab a bite to eat before any of the concerts.

Es Jardí, Mediterranean Boutique Festival

Back in Mallorca – Morcheeba in Magalluf

The first Mallorca Live Festival was held at the end of April 2016 at the Son Fusteret events ground in Palma. Headlining this were Skye & Ross – Skye Edwards and Ross Godfrey from what had been an important act formed in the mid-1990s which embraced the DJ/producer as a member of a band. With Ross's brother Paul, they were Morcheeba. They enjoyed considerable success, dropping the name after Paul left in 2014. The name was subsequently restored, and Morcheeba appeared in Mallorca in 2021 at the Mallorca Live Summer, the series of concerts after the festival, which had moved to Magalluf. Es Jardí (The Garden) is now the title of these concerts, and Morcheeba will be returning.

Deya Music Festival

The Deya International Festival of Music is a celebrated event on the island of Mallorca. 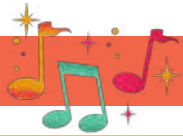
Pollensa Music Festival

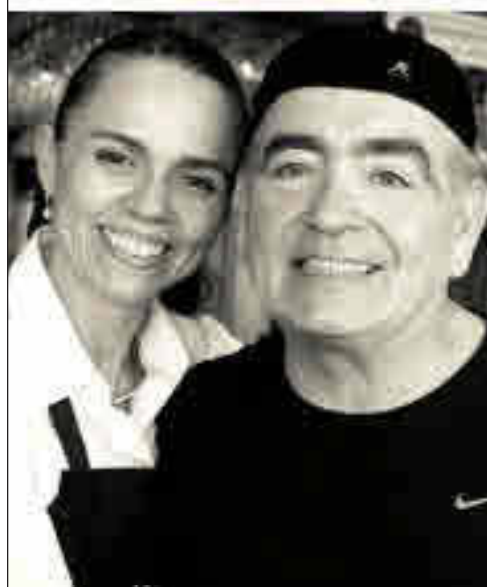

Demons raising a fiery hell, troupes of folk dancers, a local rock group belting out a number at the night party at 3am. Just some ingredients of Mallorca's summer fiestas, of which there are a great number, courtesy of the Virgin Mary and various saints and even without their blessings. While the fiestas have much in common, there is also much that differentiates them, makes them more important than others and also qualifies them as being madder than others.

July Fiestas - The Star of the Sea and the Triumphal Carriage

Marian devotion is such that there are three widely celebrated fiestas for the Virgin Mary, one of these being the **Mare de Déu del Carme**, Our Lady of Carmel. The feast day is **July 16**, this supposedly having been the day in 1251 when a Carmelite hermit from Kent, name of Simon Stock, had a vision of the Virgin Mary. For the Carmelites, Mary was their 'Stella Maris', Star of the Sea. She is the protector of those at sea, which is how she came to be the Spanish Navy's patron. These fiestas take place in **Cala Bona, Cala Figuera, Cala Ratjada, Es Capdellà, Porto Cristo, Puerto Andratx, Sa Rapita and Puerto Pollensa**, where the flotilla with the image of the Virgin Mary also has the image

of Saint Peter, the patron of fishermen.

Santa Praxedis may be an obscure saint, but she didn't used to be. Back in mediaeval times she was one of the most important saints in Palma's religious calendar (the date is **July 21**). But nowadays only **Petra** has fiestas for Praxedis, and these fiestas include a so-called 'neo-fiesta', a fiesta within a fiesta of relatively recent origin. Known as the **Festa de ses Clovelles**, the Almond Shells Fiesta, it basically involves chucking around loads of almond shells and showering everyone with

water. **Sant Jaume** most certainly isn't obscure, as he is more generally known in Spain as Santiago, the national saint. The feast day is **July 25**. **Alcudia, Algaida, Binissalem, Calvià, Manacor, Portocolom, Sa Pobla, Santanyi** all celebrate Jaume.

In **Valldemossa and Vilafranca**, there are fiestas for **Catalina Thomàs**, who was Mallorca's only home-grown saint until Juniper Serra was canonised a few years ago.

Valldemossa was her birth-

place, and on **July 28** there is one of the most iconic of all the summer fiesta occasions - the procession of the triumphal carriage with La Beata, as she is known, but as a child.

A six-year-old girl is accompanied by younger angels. Utterly charming.

Other July fiestas include **Sant Cristòfol (July 10) in Arenal and Biniali; Santa Margalida (July 20) in Sa Pobla, Santa Maria and Santa Margalida; Abdon and Senen (July 30) in Inca.**

August 15 is regarded as the peak day of the summer, as the numbers of visitors tend to decrease over the second fortnight of the month. The fiestas for the **Mare de Déu d'Agost** are thus an absolute high point. A national holiday in Spain, the fiestas are for the **Assumption of the Virgin Mary**, the ascent to Heaven. **Can Picafort** is one place that goes big on these fiestas. On the fifteenth, there is the duck swim, which nowadays has plastic ducks as prizes rather than real ones, and a massive pyromusical fireworks display that can be seen and heard across the Bay of **Alcudia**.

In **Sineu**, there is a neo-fiesta. Known as the **'Mucada'**, it is arguably the maddest of all fiesta events. Thousands descend on Sineu for a party which is based on a legendary bull-like demon who is meant to live on a nearby hill - the Muc or Much. **Caimari, Cala d'Or,**

Campos, Puigpunyent and Sencelles also have fiestas for the Mare de Déu d'Agost.

Around mid-August, it becomes difficult to know which saint or representation of Mary is actually being celebrated. **August 16** is the day of **Sant Roc**, who is highly revered, especially in **Porreres**, for having got rid of the plague. **Alaro, Cala Ratjada and S'Alqueria Blanca** are other places for Roc. Then there is **Sant Bartomeu**, Saint Bartholomew the Apostle (**August 24**). Until they were revived in **Lloret, Montuiri** was the only place in Mallorca to have maintained a tradition over the centuries - the 'rodellas' fire wheels. A demon runs up and down while these devices spit fire. **Capdepera, Consell, Ses Salines, Soller and Valldemossa** also celebrate Bartholomew.

Right at the start of the month, **August 2** is the feast day for the **Mare de Déu dels**

Àngels. Simply known in **Pollensa** as **La Patrona**, this is the day when the captain of Pollensa, Joan Mas, calls for the help of Our Lady of the Angels. "The pirates are here," bellows Joan. And then all hell breaks loose as the Christians of Pollensa confront the Moors led by Dragut for the annual re-enactment of events of 1550.

Other August fiestas include **Sant Domingo (August 4, Lloret); Sant Feliu (August 1, Llubi); Sant Salvador (August 6, Arta); Sant Llorenç, including the Tears of Saint Lawrence, the Perseid meteor shower (August 10, Sant Llorenç, Selva); Santa Candida (August 13, Llucmajor); Sant Agusti (August 28, Felanitx); Sant Joan (the death of John the Baptist) in Estellencs and Sant Joan (August 29).**

September Fiestas – Underwear and *The Smashing of Pots*

teu (**September 21**) in **Bunyola**. And the summer ends on a suitably daft note for a fiestas season that has more than its fair share of daftness. This is the **Bunyola underwear race**, which is less a race and more an excuse for only donning underwear. But September can claim to being the maddest month for fiesta events. At the start of the month, the **Canamunt-Canavall fiestas** see hundreds gather in Palma's Parc de la Mar for a massive water fight, while in **Vilafranca** - where it's a fair as much as it is a fiesta - they confront each other in a giant inflatable pool and hurl **melon**.

And as summer turns to autumn, **Binissalem** celebrates the grape harvest with its **Ver-mar fiestas**. Off they all to go to the sports field and engage in the annual grape battle. Very messy.

The final of the big three Marian fiestas revolves around **September 8**, the **Virgin Mary's birthday** - **Banyalbufar, Costitx, Fornalutx, Lloseta, Maria de la Salut** - but the most popular of September's fiestas are for **La Beata** and for a very impor-

tant date in the history of Mallorca. If Valldemossa has La Beata as a child, then **Santa Margalida** has Catalina Thomàs as a woman. The highlight is the procession on the first Sunday of the month. Based on an old folk tale and rhyme, this involves the saint encountering the devil, who smashes pots in front of her. A great deal of pot-smashing goes on, as there is a

whole gang of devils (or demons).

September 10, 1229 is when King James of Aragon and his forces disembarked in **Santa Ponsa** on what was to be the successful expedition to take Palma and Mallorca from the Muslims. The **fiestas of Rei en Jaume** therefore have a grand battle re-enactment in which the roles are reversed to those of Pollensa; the Christians are the invaders, the Moors are the defenders. The summer draws to a close with the fiestas for **Sant Ma-**

How to get to Mallorca's hotspots by

With news of constant traffic jams to Soller in recent months and in an effort to contribute to a more sustainable island, we have come up with a guide to some of Mallorca's top spots by public transport.

Soller & the port

There are two ways to get Soller and it's lovely port: bus and train. The **TIB (red and yellow) bus line 204** leaves Palma on a daily basis (first bus at 6.10am; last bus at midnight; roughly every 30 minutes). The journey is around 30 minutes to Soller and an extra 10 minutes to the port.

You can also take the scenic route on the **Soller Train**. This leaves Palma on a daily basis at 10.10am, 10.50am, 12.15pm, 1.30pm, 3.10pm and 7.40pm. Once in Soller, transfer to the tram to get to the port. A combined return ticket including both the train and the tram from Palma to Puerto Soller costs 17.5€ for children up to 6 and 35€ for adults. **The market in**

Puerto Soller takes place on Thursday and in the Soller valley on Saturday.

Formentor lighthouse

As there are traffic restrictions for the summer months, you can take the **TIB bus line 334** from Alcudia and Puerto Pollensa. The bus stops at the **Formentor beach, Cala Murta/ Cala Figuera and finally the Formentor lighthouse**. This is a daily service with the first bus leaving at 9.30am and the last at 8.25pm. The trip from Alcudia is 1 hour long. (To get to Alcudia from Palma take the **TIB bus line 302** from Plaza España.)

Valldemossa & Deya

To get to these beautiful villages you can hop on the **TIB bus line 203** from Palma. This is a daily service, with it's first bus leaving palma at 7.35am and last bus at 10pm. **Not all buses stop at Deya** so please ask

the driver before you purchase a ticket. **The market in Valldemossa takes place on Sunday and in Deya on Wednesday.**

Banyalbufar

Another very popular place on the island with visitors. You can take the **TIB bus line 202**. This service runs 7 days a week, with the first bus leaving Palma at 6.15am and the last bus at 9.15pm.

Cala Millor

If you fancy a day out to the East side of the island you can hop on the **TIB bus line 401** to Cala Millor. This service runs daily and also stops at **Algaida, Montuiri, Vilafranca, Manacor, Portocristo, S'illot and Sa Coma** before arriving at Cala Millor. The first bus leaves Palma at 5.42am, last bus at 11.07pm. To return to Palma, the first bus leaves Cala Millor at 6.20am, last bus 11.20pm. The journey from Palma to Cala Millor is around 2 hours. **Markets on this route are Algaida on Friday, Montuiri on Monday, Vilafranca on Wednesday, Manacor on**

Monday and Cala Millor on Monday.

Santa Ponsa

A popular part of the island in the summer. To get to Santa Ponsa you can take the **TIB bus line 106**, which also stops at **Portals Nous, Marine-land, Son Caliu, Palmanova, Magaluf (Western Water Park stop), Son Ferrer, El Toro** and finally Santa Ponsa. This is a daily service. From Monday to Saturday the first bus leaves Palma at 6.30am and last bus leaves at 9.50pm. On Sunday the first bus leaves Palma at 8.15am and the last bus at 9.45pm. The trip from Palma to Santa Ponsa usually takes around 1 hour. **The markets on this route are Calvia village on Monday, El Toro on Wednesday, Magaluf on Thursday, Son Ferrer on Friday, Santa Ponsa on Saturday and Palmanova on Sunday.**

How to pay

Your contactless bank card, both debit or credit, enables you to travel on the TIB network in Mallorca without having to purchase a transport ticket beforehand. The

card simply has to be **validated at the entrance and exit of the bus, train or metro**. It's that easy! Just tap-in and tap out and pay as you go. In addition, by using the same bank card, discounts are offered to groups of up to 5 people, so the more that travel on the same card, the cheaper it is per person. You can also pay in cash with banknotes up to 20 euros.

**All bus departures and times mentioned are from Palma's main transport hub, the Estació Intermodal located at Plaza España until the end of the tourist season (except for the Formentor lighthouse which goes from and to Alcudia). Mbappe set to make Spanish league debut against Real Mallorca

● Real Mallorca has unveiled their new kit for the 2024-25 season with an innovative approach. A group of 100 fans participated in the creation of the extravagant shirt, designed to ignite passion among supporters. The Vermellon club organised a city-wide scavenger hunt in Palma to introduce the new kit, featuring a striking pattern of red and black modules with black sleeves and back. The Balearic Islands flag prominently adorns the lower part of the shirt, highlighting its groundbreaking design.



The new shirt will be available for purchase in the club's physical stores and online. For the first time, a women's line will be offered. The shirt is priced at 85 euros, with an additional 15 euros for customization. Season ticket holders receive a 10% discount on all purchases.

The 24-25 season will kick off with Real Mallorca facing Real Madrid, marking the debut of Kylian Mbappé in the iconic white shirt at Son Moix stadium. This isn't the first time a Real Madrid star has made his La Liga debut in Palma; in recent summers, Palma has frequently been the stage for the first appearances of Madrid's marquee signings. Mbappé is set to be one of the big attractions of the new season and his LaLiga debut will take place

against Real Mallorca at Son Moix on the weekend of 18 August. The French international joins the list of names from the Whites' summers such as Nicolas Anelka, David Beckham and Jose Mourinho, who experienced their first matches in Spain at the Bermellón stadium. Real Madrid first played an official match at Son Moix on August 21, 1999. In that match, coached by John Ben-

jamin Toshack, all eyes were on Nicolas Anelka, a key figure in one of the summer's biggest transfer stories. Madrid won 2-1. The 2003-04 season opener was even more memorable, as David Beckham made his official debut for the 'Galacticos' at Son Moix. Real Mallorca, however, spoiled the party by winning 2-1 in

the first leg of the Spanish Super Cup, though Madrid eventually claimed the trophy. Years later, on the opening day of the 2010-11 season, José Mourinho made his Real Madrid debut with a goalless draw at Son Moix. This high-profile match echoes the excitement surrounding Kylian Mbappé's anticipated first game in a Real Madrid shirt at the same stadium.

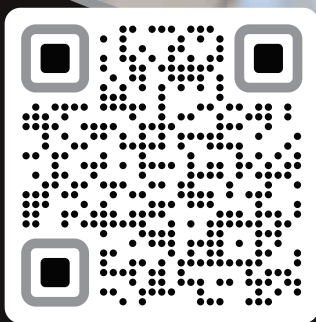

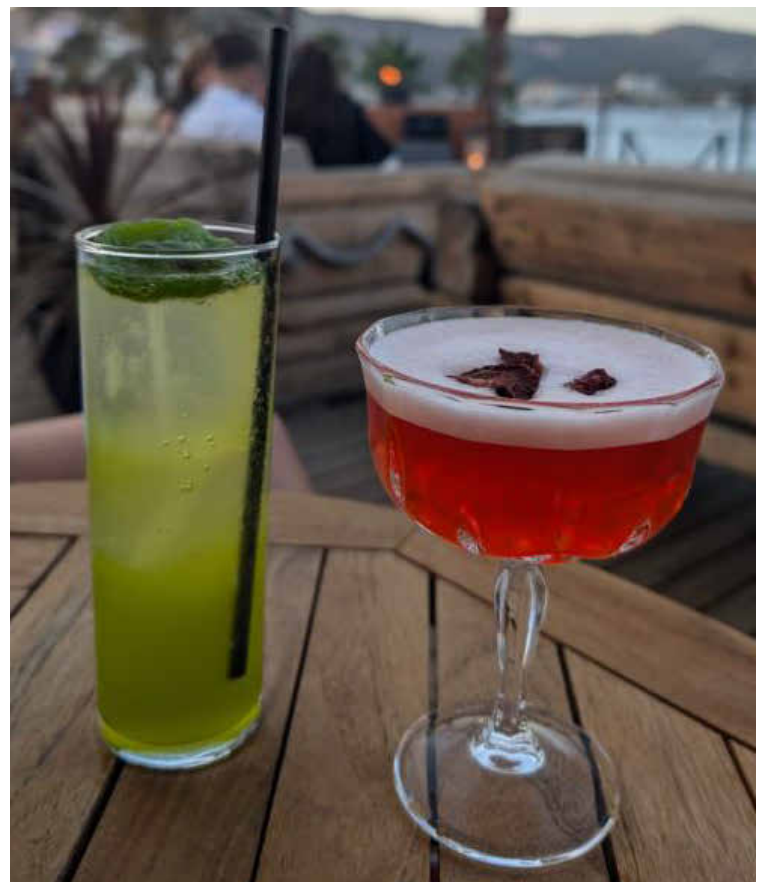
Ritzi Lounge Bar - Puerto Portals

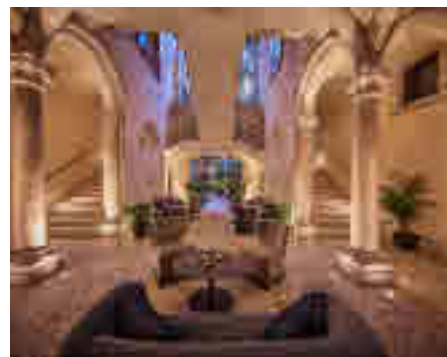
